# **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE**

Dear Friends,

The following quote offers insight into what 2016 was like for NAMI Mercer, "We cannot change the direction of the wind but we can adjust our sails." This year was still one of transition for our organization and transition is challenging. It requires us to let go of some things and ordinarily takes longer than we would like. However, if we are open and patient, the process can lead to exciting rebirth, new growth, and increased accomplishment.

We saw the beginnings of this in some highlights from 2016. Our documentary, Passage to Hope, was a shining volunteer achievement and despite a rocky road to release, it received top honors at the recent Nassau Film Festival. Attendance at public education events increased by more than 30% because of strategic partnerships with local community organizations. Our Walk generated more revenue for NAMI Mercer than any one prior.

Although we ended the year in a deficit position, we are fortunate our cash reserves allow us to manage this shortfall. We

understand the factors that contribute to current funding challenges and are taking appropriate steps to address these. It will take time to fully bridge the gap created by reductions in corporate grant-funding but we believe we are heading in the right direction. We are building for the future through more creative programming, increased strategic partnerships, and greater investment in Development initiatives.




### TREASURER'S REPORT

During fiscal year 2016, NAMI Mercer was challenged by the overall downturn in corporate grants and changes both in the timing of awards and the funding criteria for several foundations from whom we have traditionally received support. This resulted in an operating deficit of \$30,613, adjusted by other income to a bottom line loss of \$23,145. Although our fundraising events were highly successful, they did not close the gap and the shortfall was offset by cash reserves. Our Year-End 2016 total net assets totaled \$370,180 including \$115,369 in Fund for the Future.

Looking ahead to 2017, the Development Committee has proposed realistic and responsible turnaround strategies, including greater Board engagement in fundraising, refined local-donor-cultivation, and investment in increasing our fundraising capacity.




