Dear Friends,

What an incredible year 2018 was! We launched 3 new programs, Ending the Silence, The Parent Support Network, and our Summer Expressive Arts Program—all of which struck a chord in the community, significantly raising our profile as the go-to mental health resource in the New Jersey Capital region.

We have forged some remarkable partnerships — not least of which is the one with Mercer County, advocating for a Stigma-Free Mercer, bringing us closer to realizing our vision of communities where everyone belongs, and everyone can thrive. Having been identified as a preferred partner for The College of New Jersey, we have greatly expanded our internship program, helping to shape the next generation of mental health professionals and advocates.

Our fundraising efforts exceeded our goals, with NAMIWalks Mercer County NJ bringing together more than 900 walkers to raise mental health awareness and a record-breaking \$165,000 to support our programs and services, offered at no charge to participants.

At the Board Retreat in September, four strategic priorities were identified that will guide our efforts during the next three years. They include a comprehensive assessment of current and prospective constituents, the provision of responsive, accessible programming, financial stability, and partnerships with key influencers at the local level to advocate for change.

None of this would be possible without all of you who live and breathe our shared mission — every single day! Thank you for your commitment, your generosity, your care!

Stories of 18 WHO WE ARE - WHO WE SERVE...

Meet Thomas and Lillian Domenico

In the fall of 2016, we attended our first Family to Family class at NAMI Mercer NJ. By then we had been through 12 years of persistent mental illness with a family member. During these years we had utilized the healthcare and social systems to improve his condition, but the illness continued to fester and kept presenting new challenges we had to try to overcome. We eventually came to recognize how genuinely ill-prepared we and the system were in dealing with mental illness.

Attending the Family to Family class enabled us to see the scope of mental illness in our society and showed us how our experiences were consistent with the experiences of many others. The class gave real voice and practical affirmation to the failures we had encountered trying to utilize all available mental healthcare services. It is a system that fails not only the individual seeking treatment but that person's entire family.

In terms of educational background, both Lillian and I had achieved had Doctorates in Biochemistry. My wife pursued a teaching career, mentoring and training students who wished to specialize in applied sciences and medicine. I chose a career in laboratory medicine where correlations of diseases were directed to diagnoses and treatments. Mental health conditions like any other diseases are diagnosed based on symptoms and some measurable forms of brain activity. What better place could scientists like us learn more about the characteristics of mental illnesses than in a NAMI Family to Family class?

Through the class it became increasingly clear how certain responses and negative talk triggers and prolongs stressors for an individual. We learned how talk therapies seek to reduce these stressors by retraining and/ or redirecting activities in the neurological pathways of the brain and body and how psychiatric medications, biochemically analogous to chemicals produced by the body, work to inhibit the flow of energy for excitation, calming, and/or mood. However, the class proved to be significantly more than the



pursuit of information about mental illness. It became a journey of understanding -of mental illness, of treatment and recovery—and a journey of support.

Participating in the class meant so much to us, we decided to train to teach Family-to-Family. As teachers, we have continued to learn more about coping with mental illness. We have found personal satisfaction in helping others facing challenges similar to our own. And the biggest benefit that we have taken away from our Family-to-Family experience is a new form of hope. We now believe we are better equipped to help our loved one find the correct combinations of therapy and medications so he can have a more productive and happy life.

Helpline: 18 volunteers and staff fielded more than **569** calls, providing compassionate listening and personalized information and resources. **60%** of all callers were new to NAMI. **42%** were seeking support for a family member, **40%** for themselves and **18%** "other."

Our Connection Recovery Support

Group met 4x a month, enabling an average of **5** participants per session to share challenges and achievements, promoting their recovery.

Our new Hearing Voices Support Group, offered in partnership with The Hearing Voices Network, met weekly with an average of 5 participants, providing them with supportive space to share their unusual sensory perceptions in order to better manage and grow from them.

The **Parent Support Network**, offered in partnership with The Youth Mental Health Project, launched in October, at each of 3 meetings, approximately **14** caregivers of youth (under age 24) found encouragement and support.



Meet Mindy Hoffman

My name is Mindy Hoffmann, and I joined NAMI Mercer in the fall of 2016.

I was diagnosed with bipolar disorder with psychosis in 2015. I was so ill that I was hospitalized twice and ultimately unable to complete my residency program in psychiatry, which means that I lost my career as a physician. NAMI took me in with open arms and made me feel comfortable when I was at my sickest. I started out helping with mass mailings, such as putting labels on envelopes. I needed my mom to volunteer with me

for support. Gradually over the year I advanced to staffing tables at mental health fairs such as at high schools and pharmaceutical companies. My psychiatrist put me on four strong medications and my health began to improve. The staff at NAMI gave me the confidence I needed to do more. I began running social events through the "Just Friends" program, such as leading the Halloween party, New Years Party, and Olive Garden events for individuals with mental illness. I also joined "Ending the Silence" as a young adult presenter telling my personal illness story to high school and middle school students to try to put a stop to the stigma that surrounds mental health conditions. I also participated in the WRAP program and trained as an "In Our Own Voice" presenter, again telling my story. Lastly, I facilitated the support group called "NAMI Connection" to try to help others realize that those with mental illness are not alone. NAMI changed my life, facilitated my growth, and helped me become the person I am today. I am now able to work part-time as a residential counselor in a group home for those with mental illness. NAMI made me realize that mental illness cannot stop me from being successful, happy, and at peace with myself.


reasurer & REPORT

It is a pleasure to report NAMI Mercer's two fundraising events held in 2018 were both record breakers. Between the Annual Walk and Night Out with NAMI fundraising income increased \$50,000 from the prior year. 2018 was the first full year NAMI Mercer was in its new office space, which presented its own challenges to properly budget and stabilize expenses. Additionally, the Fund for the Future account held with Princeton Area Community Foundation experienced the investment losses consistent with the 2018 economy.

On a positive note, NAMI Mercer's 2019 Walk is on target to be another record-breaking year raising over \$175,000! Additionally, the Mercer County contract has been increased to \$40,000. Looking forward, the 2019 operating expenses especially those associated with the new office space have been stabilized.







